

## Maine Justice Policy Center

The information contained in the county profiles is collected by the Uniform Crime Reporting Program. Law enforcement agencies count crimes as they become known and report them on a monthly basis to the Uniform Crime Reporting Division in Augusta. The crimes that comprise the “Index Crime”, “Violent Crime”, and “Property Crime” indices are serious offenses that represent the most common crime problems. Together, these indices provide an understanding of crime trends over time.

**Index Crime:** This index includes murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Rate is per 1,000 individuals.

**Violent Crime:** This index includes murder, forcible rape, aggravated assault, and robbery. Rate is per

**Property Crime:** This index includes burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Rate is per

**Adult Arrests:** This is the number of people arrested who were age 18 or over at the time of the arrest. Each arrest is counted individually. If a person was arrested more than once, each instance is counted. This category also includes citations or summonses issued in lieu of physical custody of the person.

**Juvenile Arrests:** Juveniles (under age 18) are reported as “arrested” when the circumstances of the crime are such that they would have been arrested if they were adults, even though there may not have

**Rate of Juvenile Adjudication:** The number of juvenile adjudications per 1,000 juveniles.

**Juvenile Recidivism Rate:** The percentage of juvenile offenders with prior records who re-offended in
