Lewiston and Auburn are known as the "Twin Cities", divided by the Androscoggin River. Lewiston is Maine's second largest city; when the population is combined with that of Auburn the urban area comes very close in size to Portland. Former mill towns, the area is generally economically depressed as no new industry has replaced the factories. There is a large, established population of French-Canadians as well as a new influx of refugees from Africa and Latin America who have moved to the area within the past year because of the housing shortage in the Portland area.
