



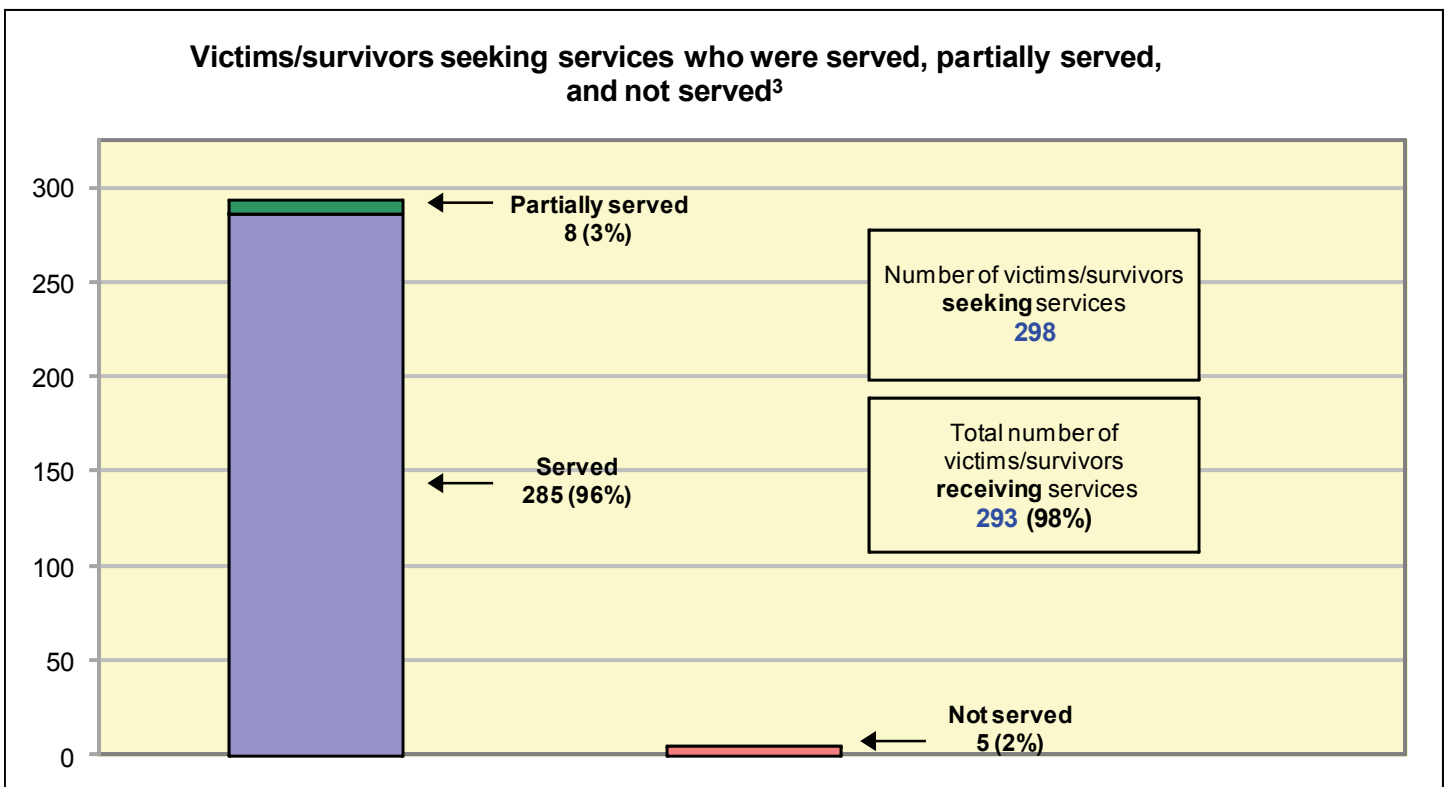

**Women Later in Life Program**  
**(Abuse in Later Life Program)<sup>1</sup>**

The purpose of the Abuse in Later Life Program is to provide or enhance training and services to address elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation, including sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking against victims who are 50 years of age or older.

**Victim Services:** Abuse in Later Life Program grantees provided services to more than **290** victims/survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, and elder abuse, neglect, or exploitation to help them become and remain safe from violence.

**Victim services and demographics:** Abuse in Later Life Program grantees provided an array of services to victims/survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, and elder abuse, neglect, or exploitation. These services include victim advocacy (actions designed to help the victim/survivor obtain needed resources or services), crisis intervention, and legal advocacy (assistance navigating the criminal and/or civil legal system). Victims/survivors receive safety planning, referrals and information as needed.

**Victims/survivors served or partially served by type of victimization:**

- Domestic violence/dating violence: **159** (54% of those receiving services)
- Elder abuse, neglect, or exploitation: **93** (32%)
- Sexual assault: **35** (12%)
- Stalking: **6** (2%)

**Number of victims/survivors receiving the following services:**

- Crisis intervention: **83** (28% of those receiving services)
- Civil legal advocacy/court accompaniment: **62** (21%)
- Counseling/support group: **59** (20%)
- Civil legal assistance: **42** (14%)
- Victim/survivor advocacy: **41** (14%)
- Criminal justice advocacy/court accompaniment: **39** (13%)
- Hospital/clinic/other medical response: **3** (1%)
- Financial counseling: **2** (1%)



<sup>6</sup> Because victims/survivors may be represented in more than one of these categories, or not at all, the total for this category may be higher or lower than the total number of victims/survivors served.

<sup>7</sup> Victims/survivors may have been abused by more than one offender and/or may have experienced more than one type of victimization, so the total for each victimization category (when unknowns are included) may be higher than the total number of victims/survivors served in each of those categories. Percentages presented here are based on the total number of known relationships in each victimization category.

**Training:** Abuse in Later Life Program grantees provide training to criminal justice professionals, governmental agencies, and community-based elder and victim service agencies.
